
While the commenters got a few things wrong (sorry, we did not actually double your elective time in the 4+4!), they captured the essence of our training program very well. As the author of the comment states:

"Medical education will always require academic rigor in clinical training. However, it remains a question whether our current models, which tend toward higher inpatient demands, are reflective of the needs of training or the vestiges of tradition. This study demonstrates creativity and flexibility to challenge seemingly fixed structures of medical training.

Burnout has long been conceptualized as an individual problem, requiring only improved personal resiliency to return to a steady state. However, studies demonstrate that the major determinants of physician well-being are more broadly determined by workplace conditions and systems in place than by individual characteristics."

I hope these results resonate with you and thank you for your (daily) contributions to this study. It reflects many of the elements of the work we have done together these last few years. My hope is that this structure - and the philosophy underlying it - provides each of you a strong bedrock upon which to build long, happy, fulfilling careers. It certainly offers the same solid ground to our leadership team, upon which we will continue to innovate and grow this program.

But that's for Julia to worry about. I'm going to allow myself to stare at Figure 2 for just a wee while longer...

Another Incredible Match!

Once again, the University of Colorado Internal Medicine program is going to be infused with energy, excitement, and immense talent from a fantastic group of incoming physicians.

The interns who will arrive in June are truly remarkable. These students displayed incredible skills at the bedside but were chosen for their additional and exceptional leadership abilities, passion for advocacy and discovery, and commitment to creating new and sustainable ways to improve the lives of others, both in and out of the usual care settings. The 68 incoming interns (Categorical, Primary Care, Hospitalist, Physician Scientist, and Preliminary Tracks) hail from 25 states and 6 countries outside the US. They will arrive representing 47 different medical schools, four of which are top international programs. 19% of our incoming class come from groups that are underrepresented in medicine, over 40% from communities that are historically excluded in medicine, and 60% of the incoming interns are women. All of these factors add important depth to our campus. We have several excellent students from the University of Colorado who have chosen to give three more years to our campus and our community and many, many more who will be joining us for the first time from across the country and the world. This group truly represents the best and brightest among the applicants to Internal Medicine this year.

A big thank you to everyone who helped make this recruitment season a true success. Our residents who showcased what our program stands for; our faculty who engaged in hundreds of interviews across several months; our coordinators and staff who made the entire season come together, including pre-look events, interview days, second looks, websites, social media, and more – thank you all!
