This center grant will bring in \$5.85 million over the next 5 years to support nutrition and obesity research in the Rocky Mountain region. A big thanks goes to all of our core and program leaders, our administrative staff, and, most importantly, all of the faculty and trainees in our research base, for their contributions to the competitive renewal of this award this past year.

### Faculty Highlight: Monica Perez Joles, PhD

Dr. Pérez Jolles is an Associate Professor in the CU
Department of Pediatrics and faculty in the Dissemination and
Implementation (D&I) Science Core at the Adult and Child
Center for Health Outcomes Research and Delivery Science
(ACCORDS). Since joining UCD in 2022, she has provided
ongoing consultations and training to scientist across campus.
Dr. Perez Jolles is also a Research Affiliate at the Gehr Family
Center for Health Systems Science, University of Southern
California, and a Research Fellow at the Cecil G. Sheps Center
for Health Services Research, UNC-Chapel Hill.



Monica obtained her PhD in Health Policy and Management, School of Public Health at UNC-Chapel Hill, and received a pre and postdoctoral HRSA T32 training fellowship on Health Services Research. She is also a former fellow from the leading D&I training fellowship at the Implementation Research Institute (IRI), Center for Mental Health Services Research, Washington University in St. Louis, MO. Dr. Pérez Jolles currently serves in national leadership roles in the field of D&I, including serving as the Chair of the Implementation of Complex/Multilevel Interventions action group hosted by the Consortium for Cancer Implementation Science (CCIS), and the Chair of the Society for Implementation Science Collaboration (SIRC) 2026 Conference. Her D&I consultations and cross-cutting research agenda includes the areas of obesity, mental health, cancer and pediatric research.

Monica draws from complex systems and implementation science methods and frameworks, such as EPIS and PRISM/RE-AIM, to align interventions to local contexts, and from collaborative engagement approaches such as implementation and process service mapping (including Failure Mode and Effect Analysis), prioritization exercises, and Co-creation workshops. She has applied the concepts of Core Functions and Forms to implementing multi-level interventions with fidelity to function and contextually tailored strategies. Her contributions are based on over a decade of experience as a health services and implementation scientist, working in partnership with Federally Qualified Health Center systems, community partners, healthcare professionals and researchers to close the health gap through team-based science. Monica also teaches in the D&I Certificate at ACCORDS and mentors clinician and PhD scientists seeking to integrate D&I and partner engagement in their research efforts to increase the uptake, impact and sustainability of interventions.

In her most recent role, Dr. Perez Jolles will lead the D&I mentoring and support program at NORC and will serve as a liaison between the center and ACCORDS with the goal of supporting members efforts to design and evaluate nutrition/obesity interventions for successful implementation and increased uptake, impact, and sustainability in real-life settings.

Outside of work, Monica enjoys training to run two half-marathons per year, traveling, hiking and spending time with her husband and two dogs.

The NORC Clinical Intervention and Translation (CIT) Core Dissemination & Implementation (D&I) Pilot Award aims to enhance NORC interventional research by adding expertise and outcomes in D&I science. Scientific discovery and its translation to the clinic and and the public increasingly require interdisciplinary collaboration between researchers with interventional and D&I expertise, as well as patient partners, to tailor interventions to the target audience and, thereby, maximize the uptake, effects, and sustainability of any intervention.

This RFA seeks to support collaborations between NORC members with ongoing or new intervention studies related to nutrition or obesity and experts in D&I science and the services offered by the Adult & Child Center for Outcomes Research & Delivery Science (ACCORDS) and CU Denver Evaluation Center.
