In this document, "resident" refers to both specialty residents and subspecialty fellows.

Purpose

To establish a formal institutional policy addressing eligibility and selection criteria for applicants to GMEC approved training programs (both ACGME and non-ACGME accredited) except non-ACGME accredited programs that appoint trainees with the CUSOM primary appointment type of Instructor/Fellow.

Policy

Applicants for ACGME-accredited programs must maintain compliance with the ACGME Institutional, Common (Residency, Fellowship, One-Year Fellowship, or Post-Doctoral), and Specialty-Specific Program Requirements.

Applicants for non-ACGME programs must meet program eligibility and selection criteria as listed in the GMEC application.

Applicants for non-ACGME programs with Non-Standard Training (NST) recognition must meet program eligibility and selection criteria including ACGME requirements for NST programs.

Applicants must meet the requirements listed below to be eligible for GMEC approved training programs.

Any prerequisite post-graduate clinical education required for initial entry or transfer into an ACGME-accredited Residency must be completed in ACGME-accredited programs, Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC)-accredited or College of Family Physicians of Canada (CFPC)-accredited programs located in Canada or in residency programs with ACGME International (ACGME-I) Advanced Specialty Accreditation. ⁴ Residency programs must receive verification of each resident's level of competency in the required clinical field using ACGME, CanMEDS, or ACGME-I milestones from the prior training program upon matriculation. ⁵	X

The CU Graduate Medical Education Committee (GMEC) must review and approve any exceptionally qualified candidates for resident/fellow appointments who do not satisfy the Sponsoring Institution's resident/fellow eligibility policy and/or resident/ fellow eligibility requirements in the Common Program Requirements. 11

In accordance with the CU GME USMLE & COMLEX, Examination Policy, applicants must have successfully completed the USMLE Step 1 and USMLE Step 2 (CK and CS) examinations, or the COMLEX Level 1 and COMLEX Level 2 examinations, as evidenced by obtaining a passing grade for the examinations prior to starting a residency. Fellowship applicants must have successfully completed the USMLE Step 3 examination or the COMLEX Level 3 examination as evidenced by obtaining a passing grade for that examination prior to starting a fellowship. Applicants must be a U.S. citizen, lawful permanent resident, refugee, asylee, or otherwise possess or be able to obtain prior to the start date the appropriate documentation to allow them to legally train at the University of Colorado School of Medicine.	Х	Х
Applicants invited to interview for a Resident/Fellow position must be informed, in writing or by electronic means, of the terms, conditions, and benefits of appointment to the program, either in effect at the time of the interview or that will be in effect at the time of his or her eventual appointment. Information that is provided must include: financial support; vacations; parental, sick, and other leaves of absence; and professional liability, hospitalization, health, disability and other insurance accessible to Residents/Fellows and their eligible dependents. Residency and Fellowship Programs must participate in the National Resident Matching Program (NRMP) or other organized match when required by the sub/specialty.
