Policy: USMLE, COMLEX and LMCC Examinations Policy

**In this document, “Resident” refers to both specialty Residents and subspecialty Fellows.**

### **Purpose:**

To ensure that Residents enrolled in training programs meet eligibility requirements to obtain medical licensure in Colorado beyond the level of the Physician Training License.

The USMLE program recommends that, for USMLE Step 3 Exam eligibility, applicants should have completed, or be near completion of, at least one post graduate training year in an accredited US graduate medical education program that meets state board licensing requirements.<sup>1</sup>

### **Policy:**

All Residents in GMEC approved programs must have successfully completed the USMLE Step 1 or the COMLEX Level 1 examination, and the USMLE Step 2 (CK) or the COMLEX Level 2 (CE) examination, as evidenced by obtaining a passing grade for that examination, prior to entering a residency.

All Residents in GMEC approved programs must successfully complete the USMLE Step 3 examination or the COMLEX Level 3 examination, or the Canadian LMCC examination, as evidenced by obtaining a passing grade for that examination, by the midpoint of the second post-graduate year (PGY2) for promotion to the third post-graduate year (PGY3).

- Exam transcripts must be provided to the GME office no later than December 31<sup>st</sup> during PGY2.
  - o Residents must schedule their exam sit date no later than October 31<sup>st</sup> during PGY2 to receive their transcripts by December 31<sup>st</sup> because USMLE process takes ~6-8 weeks.
- Residents who are non-compliant will be paid a PGY2 stipend until the required documentation is provided to the GME office.
- Failure to demonstrate passage within the stated timeline may result in academic and/or disciplinary actions such as placing the Resident on a focused review/academic probation up to non-renewal or termination from the training program at the end of the academic year.

All Fellows entering GMEC approved programs must have successfully completed the USMLE Step 3 examination, the COMLEX Level 3 examination, or the Canadian LMCC examination, as evidenced by obtaining a passing grade for that examination prior to starting a fellowship.

Original transcripts of exam score(s) must be provided at least six weeks prior to an incoming Resident or Fellow’s appointment start date.
