As a major tertiary referral center in the Rocky Mountain region, the MDC was established to address the growing need for subspecialized, interdisciplinary care and to ensure patients have access to the highest standards of diagnosis, treatment, and long-term disease management. Today, we care for more than 7,000 unique patients annually, including over 4,000 individuals with Parkinson's disease.

Our multidisciplinary team includes 10 fellowship-trained movement disorders specialists and two advanced practice providers, delivering care across multiple clinical sites, including UCHealth University of Colorado Hospital, UCHealth Boulder, UCHealth Lone Tree, the Rocky Mountain Regional VA Medical Center, and via telehealth. We collaborate closely with neuro-palliative care neurobehavioral specialists to provide comprehensive, patient-centered care. In addition, our two-year fellowship program trains up to four fellows annually, contributing to the development of the next generation of movement disorders specialists.

Our deep and sustained commitment to the Parkinson's disease community has earned the MDC designation as a Parkinson's Foundation Center of Excellence, reflecting our leadership in clinical care, research, and community engagement.
