This memorandum of study use agreement with the University of Colorado Skin Cancer Biorepository, is written with respect to the recipients responsibilities for specimens provided under this protocol.

The undersigned acknowledges that he/she is aware that all human tissue is to be handled with Universal Precautions to prevent the transmission of known or unknown pathogenic agents and accepts all responsibility for any injury, damage or loss that may result from their use.

Specimens will be collected at the University of Colorado, Anschutz Medical Campus, and sent to the recipient investigator for specific and defined scientific studies as per agreed protocols. Specimens will be de-identified and the only data that will be made available to the investigator will be a uniquely coded numbered specimen and on request clinical data regarding stage of disease, sites of primary and metastases, therapy and clinical outcome. No other identifying information will be provided including the HIPPA 18 identifiers.

The specimens provided may not be used for further studies or shared with other investigators (free of charge or otherwise) directly or indirectly without prior written approval of the Skin Cancer Biorepository Committee. All unused specimens will be returned to the University of Colorado Skin Cancer Biorepository including a record of how the samples were handled and stored.

The results generated at the recipient site will be sent for incorporation into the research database at the University of Colorado using the Skin Cancer Biorepository number. Data returned to the University of Colorado Skin Cancer Biorepository will not be used for publication at this institution, independently or otherwise. The undersigned agree upon this protocol for specimen processing and result dissemination between all parties involved in the collaboration.
