Cover Letter for Promotion – Tenured and Tenure-Eligible Track

(Suggested Length: 3-5 pages)

Instructions:

This document should primarily describe your domain(s) of excellence (Teaching, Research or Other Scholarly Activity, or Clinical Activity), highlighting the impact, significance, and reach of your most significant accomplishments. It serves as an opportunity to elaborate on achievements not fully detailed in your CV, explain non-traditional career paths, and demonstrate areas of growth since your last promotion. This letter should focus on accomplishments at your current rank.

For each domain, please indicate whether your contributions are rated Excellent or Meritorious based on the Promotions Criteria. We recommend:

- Concise summary of accomplishments in each domain of excellence (typically 2-3 paragraphs per domain, with rare exceptions).
- One paragraph for each domain of meritorious contributions.
- One paragraph for leadership and service contributions, noting that major leadership activities will be included in the relevant domain(s) of excellence.
- Tables and graphs can be included here, but may be more appropriate as supplemental materials.
- Reference relevant CV sections to minimize redundancy.

Promotion or appointment to Associate Professor requires an Excellent rating in at least one of the following domains: Teaching, Research or Other Scholarly Activity, or Clinical Activity. A meritorious rating is required in all remaining applicable domains (Teaching, Research or Other Scholarly Activity, and Clinical Activity), as well as at least Meritorious Leadership and Service contributions.

Promotion or appointment to Professor requires an Excellent rating in Research or Other Scholarly Activity, as well as an Excellent rating in either Teaching or Clinical Activity. Additionally, the candidate must demonstrate Meritorious achievements in Teaching and (if applicable) Clinical Activity, at least Meritorious Leadership and Service contributions, as well as provide evidence of a national reputation.

For the award of Tenure, candidates must present evidence of a national and international reputation and achieve Excellent ratings in both Research or Other Scholarly Activity and Teaching.

Introductory Paragraph

Begin with:

- Your name, current rank, and the rank you are applying for.
- Brief career summary, including academic training (institutions, degrees granted, and dates).

• A concise statement of your primary career focus.

Teaching & Mentorship

Rating (choose one): Excellent / Meritorious

Highlight your contributions to education and mentorship, such as:

- Teaching effectiveness and summaries of evaluations from learners (actual evaluations will be part of your supplemental materials).
- Development of educational curricula or instructional materials (if these are being used as evidence of teaching scholarship, include links to the materials).
- Mentorship of students, residents, fellows, or junior faculty (a table summarizing this should be in your CV or supplemental materials).
- Leadership roles or significant participation in education committees or training programs.
- Invited lectures, visiting professorships, and national educational presentations.
- Awards or other recognition for teaching or mentoring excellence.
- If applicable, document your national or international reputation.

Research or Other Scholarly Activity
