"Enormous progress" for tenants: Here's how the Colorado legislature tried to

help renters in 2024 is a story in *The Colorado Sun* by Brian Eason about how Colorado's Democratic majority secured a mix of major legislative wins and modest reforms that, taken together, amount to one of the largest policy packages aimed at renters in the state's history.

A program to move unhoused folks directly into permanent housing secured funding, but sustainability is an issue is a post on the *Denverite* by Desiree Martin about how a council committee approved a \$5 million contract with Housing Connector, a nonprofit that connects people experiencing homelessness to property owners.

Many in the technology industry say Senate Bill 205 is too broad.



<u>School-based Asthma Trial Expands Across Colorado</u> is a post on the ACCORDS website by Melissa Santorellli about three new publications from a team of CU researchers that highlight their study to improve asthma disparities in children.

Colorado fentanyl deaths continue to rise. Here's the DEA's new approach to combat the problem. is a story in *The Colorado Sun* by Ernesto Cabral about how more than 1,000 people died from fentanyl poisoning in 2023, up 18.4% from the year before according to preliminary data from the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment. The DEA has announced a new strategy to address this problem.

Language Concordance: The Missing Pillar in Patient-Centered

<u>Communication</u> is a blog post by Maria Jose Ruiz and Santiago Avila on the Milbank Memorial Fund website about evidence that shows U.S. patients with non-English language preferences are more likely to have poorer care experiences and outcomes. The authors call for better implementation of laws and policies requiring language services and for medical schools to prioritize teaching communication skills, including best use of interpreter services for patients.
