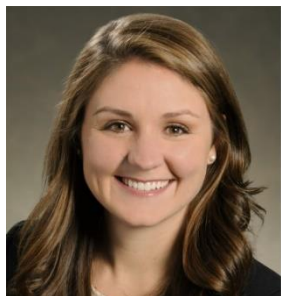

The **Craniofacial Orthodontics Clinic** was recently featured in the most recent edition of the Rocky Mountain Society of Orthodontists' newsletter. This center is the **only center of its kind in the Rocky Mountain Region** and provides access to complex orthodontic care to children with Cleft Lip and Palate and other craniofacial conditions requiring a multidisciplinary surgical approach. Located in the Health Pavilion, the clinic has recently expanded to accommodate treatment of all pediatric orthodontic patients. [Link to full article](#)



Dr. Puranik, Pediatric Dental Center has received a prestigious **Grubstake grant** for 2022. This 3 year, \$350,000 grant will support research on caries-inhibiting and regenerative dental materials. The Gates Center for Regenerative Medicine and CU Innovations offers the Gates Grubstake Award focused on accelerating basic, clinical, and translational research related to the field of regenerative medicine for improvement in diagnostics and therapeutics including cellular-tissue engineering and devices.

In addition, **Dr. Puranik's** project, "Preventing Dental Caries with Novel Coatings", was selected as winner out of 386 funded projects at the Proof of Concept Network (POCN) Innovator Showcase at the National Institutes of Health Small Business Education and Entrepreneurial Development (NIH-SEED) Annual Meeting 2021. The team also included: Devatha Nair (School of Dental Medicine), and Michael Schurr (School of Medicine, Department of Immunology and Microbiology). The team has been invited to participate, in-person, at the next annual POCN conference and NIH-SEED will be sponsoring the registration.

Todd Hankinson, Neurosurgery has received several small awards totaling \$55,000 from the Morgan Adam's Foundation for his projects including: Development of a public web-based tool to refine interpretable AI tools in pediatric neuro-oncology, Preclinical testing of the small molecule inhibitors Navitoclax, and Binimetinib using ex vivo Adamantinomatous Craniopharyngioma Tissue, Demonstrate the Impact of MMP-9 Knockdown in 3 Novel ACP Models and Multiplex Immunofluorescence spatial distribution in ACP
