This month we celebrate the amazing career of Dr. Alberto Peña as he looks to retire February 1, 2021.

Dr. Peña is undoubtedly one of the most recognized names in the global pediatric surgical community. He is credited with the original description in 1981 of the technique of posterior sagittal anorectoplasty; the operation that bears his name (the Peña procedure [posterior sagittal anorectoplasty]). His early career contributions have

forever changed the field after his seminal contribution of the outcome-changing operation that bears his name. Dr. Peña has focused his career on innovation in the technical aspects of surgical repair of patients with anorectal malformations. Dr. Peña is known both nationally and internationally and is considered to be a master surgeon, educator, researcher, and mentor. Dr. Peña has served as the Director of the International Center for Colorectal and Urogenital Care at CHCO since 2016. Under his expertise and leadership, this program has become a world renowned destination program. A virtual celebration is planned in the coming days, as well as a reception during a future Peña course. We wish Dr. Peña and his family the very best moving forward.

- "One stop shop": refer to LM and the patient will be triaged to appropriate tier
- For referral to Lifestyle Medicine go to EPIC orders and type "lifestyle" and follow the prompts
- For specific referral to bariatric surgery go to EPIC orders and type "bariatric" and follow the prompts (when BMI is >35 with comorbidities or BMI >=40 even without comorbidities)
