

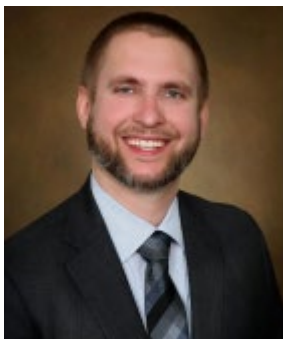


Faculty Updates

The Center for Children's Surgery's **6th Annual Research**

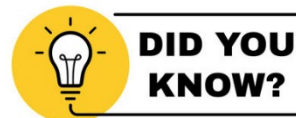

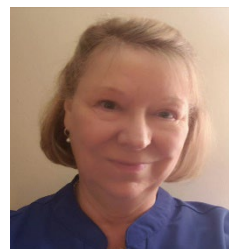

Please join us in welcoming **Dr. Ankush "Ash" Gosain, MD, PhD**, our new Chief of **Pediatric Surgery** effective Jan. 16, 2023

Dr. Gosain comes to us from the University of TN Health Sciences Center where he served as Vice-Chair for Academic Affairs for the Department of Surgery, as Senior Surgical Advisor for Quality and Safety at Le Bonheur Children's Hospital and as Director of Surgical Research at the Children's Foundation Research Institute. He brings an NIH-funded basic & translational science

laboratory studying the enteric nervous system and gastrointestinal mucosal immune development and function as they relate to congenital colorectal disease (e.g., Hirschsprung disease) and aberrant intestinal homeostasis, with the overarching goal of developing novel therapies. His laboratory is working to develop cellular therapies to restore enteric nervous system development in Hirschsprung disease and neuro-immunomodulatory therapies to prevent or treat Hirschsprung-associated enterocolitis. Dr. Gosain's clinical expertise includes colorectal disease, congenital diaphragmatic hernia, oncology, and trauma.

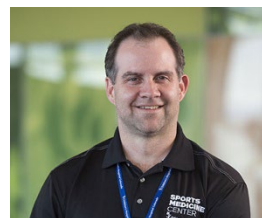
We would also like to extend our sincere gratitude for the excellent leadership of **Dr. David Partrick** who has graciously served as the Interim Chief over the past 14 months.
