



- Short-term behavioral health services: Accountable Care Collaborative Phase II (colorado.gov)

- The intention around these policies is that a PCP may provide 6 behavioral health visits to a member. After the 6th visit, care should be transferred to a licensed behavioral health clinician for continued service.
