

## CME & COPIC Points

Providers (MD, DO, NP, PA) that attend the IT MATTTRs Team Training are eligible for continuing medical education (CME) and COPIC Points.

### COPIC Points

The IT MATTTRs team has received approval from COPIC to allow providers (MD, DO, NP, PA) that attend the IT MATTTRs Primary Care Practice Team Training to be eligible for up to 2 COPIC Points.

The amount of money to pay for medical liability policies are affected by the number of COPIC points affiliated with a practices provider(s), if a provider has medical liability through COPIC. COPIC points count towards discounts on medical liability insurance, and are linked to a specific provider (not a practice). For providers to earn COPIC points through IT MATTTRs, our team will track provider attendance (via attendance sheets & field notes) at each module of the primary care practice team training.

- Providers that attend 4 or more team training modules = 2 COPIC points
- Providers that attend between 1 and 3 team training modules = 1 COPIC point

When a practice has completed the primary care team training modules, the IT MATTTRs team will report the number of points each provider will be rewarded directly to COPIC. COPIC points are reported monthly; if you need immediate assistance, please contact [itmatttrs2@ucdenver.edu](mailto:itmatttrs2@ucdenver.edu).

### Continuing Medical Education (CME)

Providers that attend the IT MATTTRs team training receive up to 4 AMA PRA Category 1 credits. The number of CME hours claimed should correspond with the number of hours of training the provider attended.

*AMA Credit Designation Statement:*

The American Society of Addiction Medicine designates this live activity for a maximum of 4 AMA PRA Category 1 Credit (s). Physicians should claim only the credit commensurate with the extent of their participation in the activity.

*ACCME Accreditation Statement:*

The practice team trainer will hand out letters to physicians (MDs & DOs) and non-physicians (NPs & PAs) for their CME records. The team trainer may choose to pre-populate the letter date, training location, and training date (date of the final module); we recommend leaving the “name and degree” section blank for a practice manager or provider to complete.
