ISP Program Changes

- Practices can now start ISP on a monthly basis (rather than waiting until July for the next start)
 - Enroll by the 15th of the month, start that month
 - Enroll after the 15th of the month, begin the next month
 - New practices added to PTO's scope of work on the 16th of each month
 - PTO leads are contacted to accept practices and then are cc'd on practice's welcome email
 - New practices added to SPLIT weekly
 - Please remember that PTO admins must assign the PF to the practice in order for the practice to appear in the PF view: How To Guide
 - Will send complete practice lists with start dates to all PTOs this Friday
 - Moving forward: on the 15th of the month for those PTOs who have had new practices added that month

How We Can Help: Workflows

PATIENT WAITS TO SEE PROVIDER

- Patient waits to see provider, either in waiting room or exam room
- · Non-clinical staff identifies patients to ask
- * PRAPARE based on their approximate wait times

*

NON-CLINICAL STAFF ADMINISTERS PRAPARE WHILE PATIENT WAITS

- Non-clinical staff explains why they are administering PRAPARE and how it can help inform the patient's care plan
- Non-clinical staff goes through PRAPARE with patient or lets patient self-administer using lpad, tablet, or paper form

DOCUMENT PRAPARE RESPONSES

 Non-clinical staff records and dates the patient's answers and/or updates in the PRAPARE EHR template, using ICD-10 Z codes when possible

PATIENT SEES PROVIDER

- Provider views PRAPARE data in the Electronic Health Record
- Patient's socioeconomic situation is taken into account when providing treatment plans and prescriptions

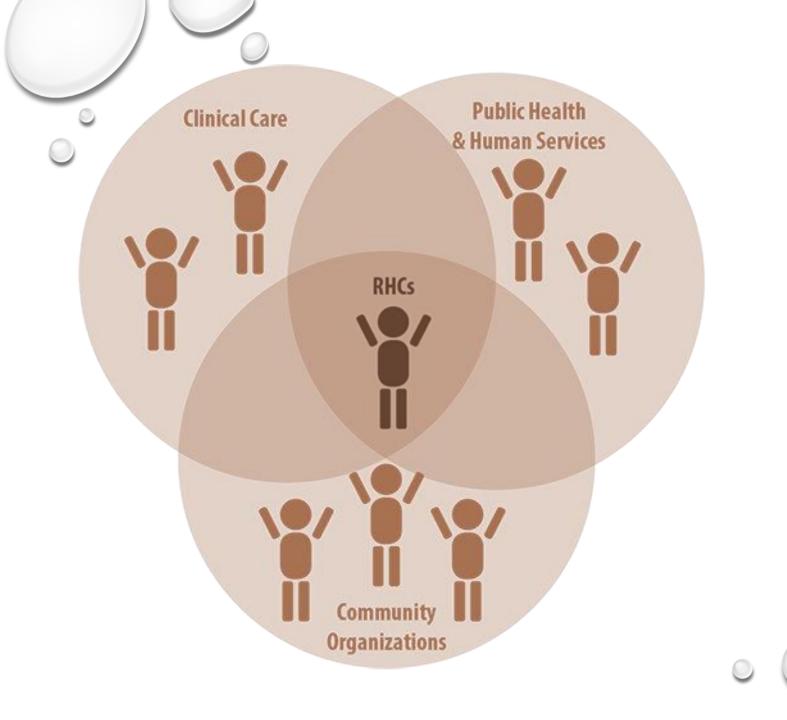
RESPOND TO NEEDS

- Provider or non-clinical staff connects patient to available resources, either those available in-house or those available in the community
- If no needs are identified, provider or nonclinical staff will flag next appointment for annual PRAPARE screening

CLOSE THE LOOP

- Non-clinical staff follows-up with patient to determine if resources were utilized
- Document in the Electronic Health Record

** PRAPARE = One available social needs screening questionnaire

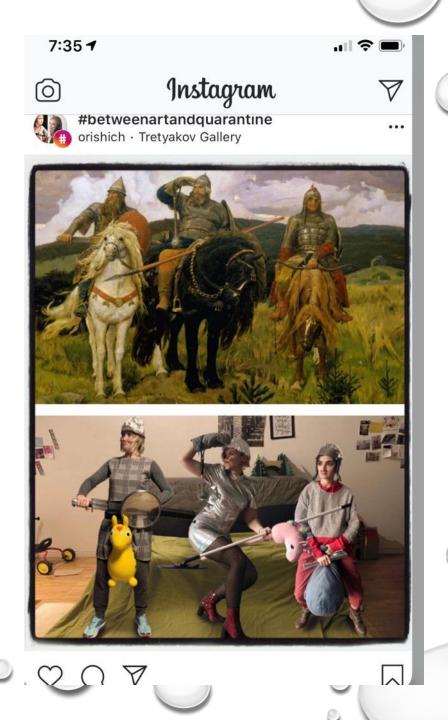

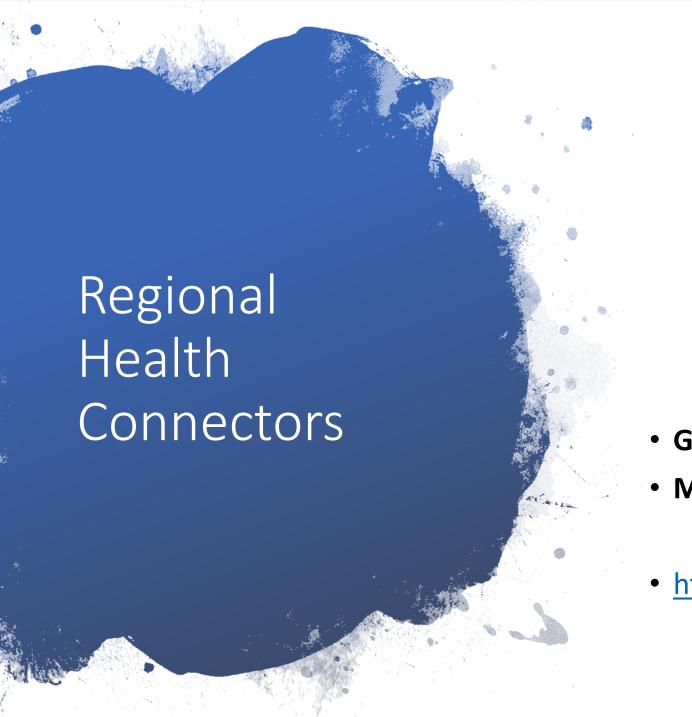
