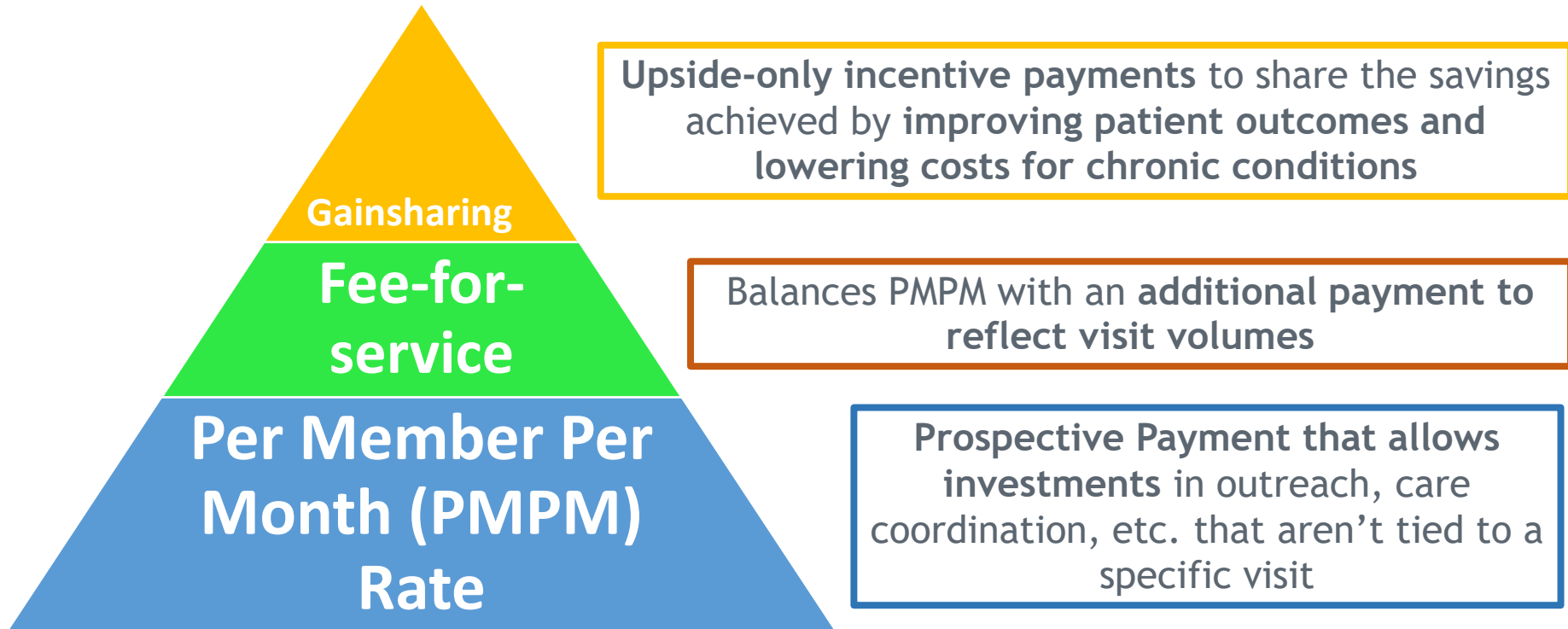
APM 2 Overview



APM 2 Pillars

Goal: increase equity, improve health outcomes, and lower cost by redistributing money to primary care

Provider Reimbursement



Pediatric Eligibility

- The State recognizes the difference between adult and pediatric primary care and is working to create a separate track for pediatricians
- That design process will begin in Fall 2022
- In the interim, pediatricians are welcome to participate in APM 2 with the PMPM and chronic conditions

Ability to choose revenue breakdown

The State sent out incorrect workbooks with inaccurate PMPM payment amounts initially. The actuarial process has been improved and rates are now accurate. We strongly encourage practices who received initial workbooks to request new data.

Data Sharing Solutions

The State is developing robust data sharing dashboards to help providers target chronic condition spending

Will improve both program outcomes and offer more provider support

Federal Approval Update

PMPM

- All services will be shadow billed & reconciled at the end of the year
- If the PMPM is below the shadow billed amount, provider will receive additional funding
- If PMPM is above the shadow billed amount, provider can retain excess if they meet quality measures
- First year of participation is risk-free

Gainsharing

- Eligibility for gainsharing payments unlocked if providers meet quality measures

Quality Measures: Must achieve 200 points or greater on quality measures in the APM 1 program

REVIEW DATA WORKBOOK & MATERIALS

SCHEDULE FOLLOW-UP DATA WALK THROUGH
WITH STATE IF NEEDED (UP TO TWO SESSIONS)

Enrollment Process

1. Provider confirms interest
2. Provider lists out preferred PMPM & start date
3. State drafts Notification Letter with program details & requirements
4. Provider signs letter and returns to State
5. System changes made as needed by State
6. State follows-up with provider to confirm PMPM payments made as expected

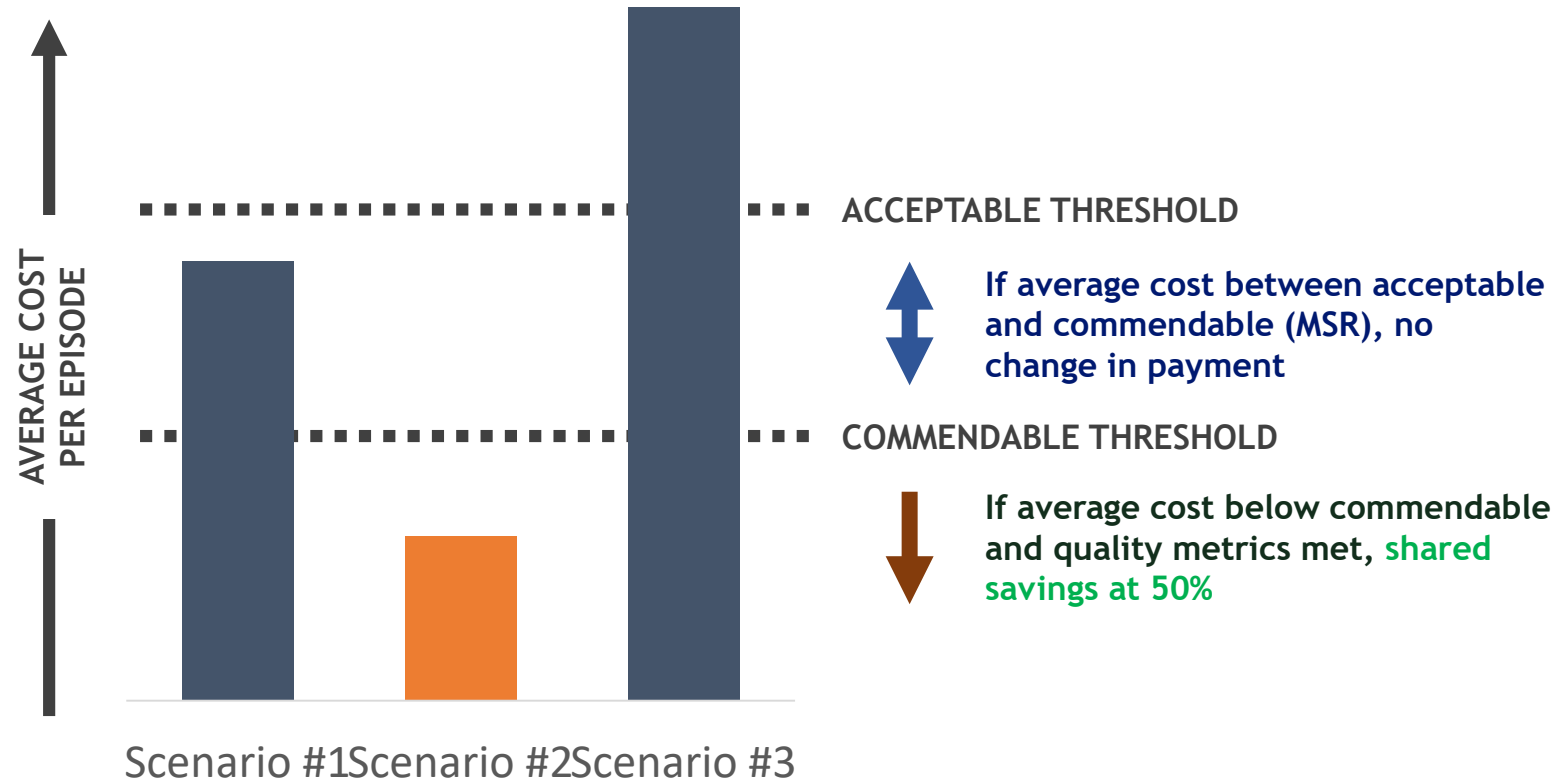
