ICLOUD: Interprofessional Clinical Opioid Use Disorder Training Program



Background

- The U.S. continues to confront an unprecedented opioid abuse epidemic:
 - In 2017, over 72,000 overdose deaths were reported in America
 - Estimated 2.1 million Americans met criteria for opioid use disorder (OUD)
 - An estimated 47,000 Coloradans reported OUD
- A multifaceted prevention approach has been championed by federal agencies
 - A DATA (Drug Addiction Treatment Act) Waiver for licensed providers to prescribe buprenorphine is a key facet of OUD treatment
 - Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) programs have proliferated to move treatment out of urban centers and into primary care settings and rural geographies
 - SAMHSA has supported training programs in academic health centers to include OUD and DATA Waiver education into pre-licensure programs and across disciplines

ICLOUD Training Program:

SAMHSA-funded program, 2019-2022. Goals include:

- Develop an interprofessional OUD curriculum for at least 700 NP, PA, and MD students, incorporating at least 8 hours of required DATA Waiver training
- Increase provision of MAT in clinical care settings via pre-licensure
 IPE and new electives focusing on addiction medicine

Curricular Elements:

- 1. Interprofessional didactic training
 - a. 4-hour live buprenorphine training
 - b. Book club, reflective awareness assignments
 - c. Digital education follow-up and support
- 2. Interprofessional clinical training
 - a. Specialty clinical experiences with MAT provision
 - b. Interprofessional clinical training on-site
 - c. IPE SIM with OUD scenarios
- 3. Interprofessional elective education
 - a. AMC student interest group
 - b. IPE Open Campus educational seminars
 - c. Elective courses, cross-schools

Program Outcomes:

- 1. 100% completion of 8 hours DATA training for all eligible students across programs
- 2. At least 100 students participate in elective book club events or online discussions
- 3. >70% student agreement of "high-quality" OUD training in curriculum evaluations
- 4. 10% or more 12-month follow-up of all graduates completing DATA Waiver training and/or providing MAT
