Most recipient and donor characteristics were similar between the groups, but recipients during the pandemic period were less likely to have ventilatory support before transplant than those during the pre-pandemic period (7% vs. 12%; $P = .01$), **John Iguidbashian**, a general surgery resident at the University of Colorado School of Medicine, and colleagues wrote.
