
Meet Our Team

The University of Colorado School of Medicine is located on the Anschutz Medical Campus in Aurora, CO. The Anschutz Medical Campus is a comprehensive academic medical center serving more than 28,000 students in metropolitan Denver and online. There are 4,000 degrees awarded each year on campus, including more graduate and professional degrees than any other Colorado public institution. The campus offers 119 highly rated degree programs through 13 schools and colleges. Children's Hospital Colorado, University of Colorado Hospital and the Rocky Mountain Regional VA Medical Center is located on the Anschutz Medical Center as well.

About the Program

The University of Colorado School of Medicine (CU SOM) Administrative Fellowship is a 12- month post-graduate training program designed to prepare participants for administrative leadership roles in academic medicine. Fellows will receive comprehensive exposure to the management of a highly ranked academic medical center; working with senior leaders in the School of Medicine, Fellows will observe and participate in decision-making on complex issues involving teaching, research and clinical care.

The CU SOM Administrative Fellowship Program at the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus started in the summer of 2023 with two Administrative Fellows.

Fellowship Structure

Fellows will report to the Senior Associate Dean for Administration and Finance, the Program Preceptor. The Preceptor will coordinate and structure the learning process and provide appropriate resources to Fellows.

In addition to attending senior leadership meetings in the School of Medicine with the Preceptor, the Fellow will complete 3-4 projects during the year in various areas including but not limited to:

- Finance
- Human Resources
- Information Technology Services
- Faculty Affairs
- Research Administration (Office of Grants and Contracts)
- Education Administration (Graduate and Undergraduate Medical Education)
- Faculty practice management (revenue cycle, clinic operations in the community practice division)
- Department led projects

The Fellowship will conclude with a capstone presentation of project work and deliverables.

Program Requirements

Applicants should have a graduate degree in Healthcare Administration, Business Administration, Public Health, Public Administration, Nursing Administration, or an equivalent degree program.

Applicants must have earned their degree prior to starting the Administrative Fellowship Program. The only exception is for those masters' programs which require a residency or fellowship prior to matriculation but who have completed their didactic requirements.

Applicants must have the ability to comply with all University of Colorado policies and guidelines for employment.

Application Materials

Applicants must apply via the CU Careers job posting with all required materials:

- Current Resume or CV
- Copies of unofficial undergraduate and graduate transcripts
- Three signed letters of recommendation
 - At least one from the program director or faculty member from your graduate program
 - At least one from a current or former employer
 - Third letter can be from graduate program, employer, or academic/professional reference of your choice
 - If preferred, recommender(s) may send letter directly to fellowship program manager email.
- Personal Statement (two-page limit)
 - Why do you want to pursue an administrative fellowship within the University of Colorado School of Medicine?
 - Where did you gain an interest in pursuing academic medicine?
 - What are your fellowship and future career objectives, and how will this fellowship help you to achieve those goals?
