Strategies to boost engagement and learning.

- Pause for Peer Processing
 Incorporate 3-4 minute pauses every 10–15 minutes.
 Have learners pair up to review and discuss key points.
- 2 Use Bulleted Breaks
 Distribute content as unordered bullet points. Have groups organize the ideas and generate questions.
- Ask Purposeful Questions
 Ask learners questions during the lecture and use follow-up questions to deepen their thinking.
- Turn Content into Clinical Cases
 Use real-world clinical scenarios to engage learners in problem solving and decision-making.
- Leverage Interactive Polling Tools
 Use tools like Poll Everywhere or Kahoot to spark discussion, and to surface gaps for clarification.
