SICK AND TIRED:

Galvanizing Multi-Stakeholder Efforts to Address Structural Racism and Persistent Health Disparities

In the United States, minoritized, rural, and low-income populations continue to experience suboptimal access to and quality of health care despite decades of recognition of health disparities and policy mandates to eliminate them. Many interventions that were designed to achieve health equity fall short because of gaps in knowledge and translation.

Dr. Purnell will describe existing gaps and highlight innovative interventions that help address them, focusing on the power of multi-stakeholder engagement. Dr. Purnell will also provide recommendations for advancing the field of health equity and informing future efforts to tackle structural racism.
