"Dr. Garrison is a one-of-a-kind physician! She's been amazing from the day I started working with her, which just happened by chance - I was seeing a PA practicing under Dr. Garrison and needed a procedure that can't be performed by a PA. Dr. Garrison lovers her patients and she always takes the time she needs to make sure you don't walk away until she's addressed the issues you bring to the table."

Women's Health Symposium: Saturday, February 24, from 8:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m. - Anschutz Health Sciences Building, with some virtual access




ELearning for Alzheimer's Disease and Related Dementias
