





CU Medical Students' Research Featured in the Annals of Family Medicine COVID-19 Collection:

The COVID-19 Pandemic has led to a shortage of personal protective equipment, especially N95 respirators and surgical masks across the country. While much of the attention has been on large urban hospitals managing the surge of patients infected with SARS-CoV-2, primary care offices and rural communities where many family physicians serve, have been especially hard hit by these mask shortages. Family physicians have had to turn to alternative means of protecting themselves and their staff via utilization of cloth masks. This has been of particular interest to the public, who have been making cloth masks for providers as a way of contributing during the pandemic response. Four CU Medical Students (Ariel Kiyomi Daoud, Jessica Kole Hall, Haylie Petrick, and Anne Strong) in conjunction with Dr. Cleveland Piggott (CU Department of Family Medicine) sought to review the literature to summarize evidence on cloth masks ability to protect healthcare providers from respiratory viral infections. They found that “cloth masks lack evidence for adequate protection of HCPs against respiratory viral infections.” Read their full pre-print article here: **The Potential for Cloth Masks to Protect Healthcare Providers from SARS-CoV-2: A Rapid Review.**
