Past the Pandemic Programming

Past the Pandemic: Coping in COVID is a foundational program being offered by our Department of Psychiatry and Project ECHO Colorado. The program is available to health care providers and other staff in health care settings to name, normalize, and validate worries and experiences during the pandemic and beyond.

Summer 2022 Programs

Coping in COVID Live Sessions

The original 6-week interactive series offered in collaboration with ECHO Colorado. Each week we discuss psychoeducational didactics on topics of stress, burnout, grief, mindfulness, relationships, role management, connection, and more. A Toolkit will be provided and encouraged to use.

Coping in COVID Canvas Course

A self-paced asynchronous course offering the same curriculum above, but without live session commitment. You will be invited as a student into this course and be able to access the material and resources in your own time. You will receive a certificate of completion as a Wellbeing Champion.

Beyond Burnout Workshop

A 3.5 hour workshop providing a condensed version of Modules 1 & 2 of Coping in COVID, as well as additional tools to mitigate stress injury formation in the workplace. This workshop will provide curriculum, interactive activities, and discussion to build community and connection. A supplemental Toolkit for teams will be provided. You will receive a certificate of completion as an Ambassador of Wellbeing in the Workplace.


ICYMI - In Case You Missed It
