We provide a supportive, friendly learning community with a physician wellness curriculum and a strong advising and mentoring program.

We have an innovative longitudinal curriculum highlighting practice transformation and community engagement.

Our two tracks offer different continuity practices:

Lowry Family Health Center (DH Track) – a Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC) in the Denver Health

system with a large immigrant and refugee patient population (approximately 25% Spanish speaking and 50% non-English/non-Spanish speaking)

AF Williams Family Medicine (UH Track) – an innovative practice known for being on the forefront of practice transformation. Awarded the 2016 STFM Family Practice Management Award for Practice Improvement, given to the top residency practice in the nation that is leading practice transformation

All residents spend significant time at the following impressive training sites:

Denver Health Medical Center – Colorado's premier safety net hospital—a longtime partner with the University of Colorado, with integrated Community Health Centers, School Based Health Centers, Denver Department of Public Health, Correctional Care, and Emergency Services (Level 1 Trauma Center)

University of Colorado Hospital – a vibrant regional health center with rich educational and research experiences

Children's Hospital Colorado – ranked the 7 best children's hospital in the nation by "US News and World Report" in 2023

We include rich interdisciplinary learning with pharmacologists, psychologists, psychiatrists, addiction specialists, and Sports Medicine physicians teaching on our inpatient and outpatient care teams.

We encourage participation in evening interest working groups composed of faculty and residents in Public Policy, Social Justice, Refugee Health, Medical Education, and Community Engagement.

We offer an optional Advanced Maternity Care Concentration (AMCC).

Our commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion is reflected in our longitudinal curriculum, Social Justice Workgroup, and recruitment practices as well as within our department.

We have curricula in LGBGT care and addiction medicine.

Multiple opportunities to participate in scholarly work with publications, QI work, and program development.
