

Trauma-Sensitive Assessment Services for Kids (TASK) Program

What is TASK?

- We are a group of healthcare professionals who assess **children ages 3-12** with traumatic experiences and developmental concerns.

What is the purpose of the assessment?

- Each child is unique. We consider **all areas of your child's wellbeing**, such as:
 - Physical and emotional health.
 - Culture, relationships, and values.
 - Supports for you and your child.
 - Participation in everyday activities.

What does the assessment involve?

- We will schedule **four appointments with you and your child**:
 - A **virtual** Intake Session (1.5 hours).
 - An **in-person** Neuropsychological and Psychiatric Assessment (4 hours).
 - An **in-person** Occupational Therapy and Pediatric Medical Exam (1.5 hours).
 - A **virtual** Feedback Session (2 hours).
- You and your child's teachers will **complete questionnaires**.

What do you do with the assessment?

- Our team will **discuss findings** of the assessment with you at the Feedback Session.
 - We encourage you to invite **all members** of your child's care team.
- Findings and recommendations will be sent in a written report within 3 weeks after the Feedback Session.
