
# **Travel Award Funding Announcement**



# Travel Award for The Ludeman Family Center for Women's Health Research 2024 National Conference in Colorado Springs, CO

# **ABOUT THE AWARD**

The Ludeman Family Center for Women's Health Research (Ludeman Center) will support the development of six early-career investigators who are focused on women's health or sex and gender differences by providing travel awards to attend the Sex Differences Across the Lifespan: A Focus on Cardiometabolism and Mental Health National Conference on October 23-25, 2024 in Colorado Springs, CO. The Ludeman Center requests that interested investigators submit an application including an abstract focused on women's health or sex and gender differences for consideration to be presented as a poster at the 2024 National Conference. The Ludeman Center faculty will review the applications in order to choose six applicants who will receive travel awards. Attendance at the Sex Differences Across the Lifespan: A Focus on Cardiometabolism and Mental Health National Conference will be a unique opportunity for investigators to learn from and connect with leading scientists working to answer the critical questions in women's health and sex and gender differences.

# **AWARD AMOUNT**

A total of six awards of up to \$2,000 each will be available to support travel and attendance-related costs for selected applicants.

### APPLICATION AND AWARD TIMELINE

- Applications are due June 30, 2024, by 6:00 pm MST.
- Award recipients will be announced by July 31, 2024. Individual awardees will be notified via email.

#### **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

- Early-career faculty (Instructors & Assistant Professors), Fellows or PhD Candidates who submit an abstract to present a poster at the National Conference held in Colorado Springs, Colorado on October 23-25, 2024.
- Criteria for selection will be for candidates whose work shows promise in the area of women's health or sex and gender differences research. Priority for the travel awards will be given to researchers whose work relates to the session topics of the National Conference. Please refer to the agenda found at <u>ludemancenter.org</u>.

# Sex Differences Across the Lifespan: A Focus on Cardiometabolism and Mental Health Travel Award

- Only 1 travel award will be given per institution.
- Must be the first author on the submitted abstract for presentation.
- Recipients must be able to attend all three days of the conference.

# **HOW TO APPLY**

Applications must be combined into one PDF and submitted electronically to Carly Pilius (<u>carly.pilius@cuanschutz.edu</u>) no later than **June 30, 2024 6:00 pm MST**. Applications should include the following as instructed below:

- Format of Travel Award Application: Applications must have one-inch margins and use 11-point Arial font.
- Face Page: Provide your name, academic positions, schools, departments and contact information (email, phone, mailing address).
- **Abstract:** Include a copy of the abstract used to generate a poster for presentation, including title and authors. Limit to 500 words in length.
- **Biographical Sketch (current NIH Form):** Biographical sketch which lists <u>all current and pending research support</u>. Please use the most current NIH form.
- **Letter of Support** from your academic advisor, mentor, or fellowship director endorsing your attendance as a benefit towards your research/career.
