





Lung cancer is a disease that happens when cells in the lungs experience abnormal changes in their DNA that causes them to grow out of control.

WHAT ARE POSSIBLE SIGNS AND SYMPTOMS?

- · Cough that does not go away or coughing up blood
- Shortness of breath
- Chest pain when breathing, coughing, or laughing
- · Lung infections (bronchitis, pneumonia) that don't go away
- Yellowing of the skin or eyes (jaundice)

SCREENING

Get annual screening with a low dose CT scan if:

- You are 50 years or older, AND
- · You smoke or used to smoke, AND
- You smoked 1 pack or 20 cigarettes per day for 20 years*

*Or 2 packs a day for 10 years, 5 packs a day for 4 years, etc.



RISK FACTORS

- Secondhand smoke exposure
- Radon exposure
- Asbestos exposure
- Previous radiation on or near chest
