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Frequently Asked Questions:

Can I use images obtained from a non-butterfly machine towards my portfolio?

Unfortunately, there is no current way for us to feasibly do this for such a large program. We know that the image quality is better on the nicer machines and really wish that there was a way to easily include those images in your portfolio, but the process is currently extremely onerous on both ends without a reliable way to track. Because your portfolio requirement is relatively small, we are confident you will have adequate time to obtain the required images using the butterfly machines while still occasionally scanning with alternative machines.

What happens if I miss a deadline?

It will count as a missed deadline towards part of the residency missed deadline policy.

Why is the portfolio required? Can I use images from my mentored scanning session towards my portfolio?

While we will help you upload one image during didactic 1 that will count towards your portfolio. The remaining scans you do during your mentored scanning half days will NOT count towards your portfolio. The reason for this is that for adequate POCUS skill development and maintenance, it is incredibly important to be able to scan independently and not just with a mentor present. This is based off current POCUS literature and recommendations from multiple national societies including the AAIM. Regardless of the interest level in POCUS, the truth is that only a small portion of POCUS learners (this includes students, residents, faculty) will actually practice and improve their skills for clinical use if they are not challenged to scan WITHOUT a proctor present and learn how to troubleshoot on their own. We have each participated in multiple curriculums with more of a "bootcamp" structure without follow-up, and unfortunately it results in attrition of skills and limited actual use of POCUS. And personally, the only way we were able to improve our own skills was to scan on our own and practice over time. Thus, we feel one of the most valuable aspects of our curriculum is this requirement and feel its extremely important that portfolio is acquired independently rather than being an aspect of the proctored sessions.


How can I check my portfolio progress?

- 1. Log onto your butterfly account on any computer via cloud.butterflynetwork.com
- 2. Select "Analytics" in the upper right corner
- 3. Click on "All authors" and type your name to filter just for you
- 4. Now, scroll down to see "performance indicators by user"
- 5. Select the arrow next to your name to expand your study types
- 6. Scroll all the way to the right and you will see a column "Counts towards proficiency." These numbers represent your PASSING images.

*Important: The exam type "complete renal" is ONLY for the advanced certificate. If you accidentally utilize this exam type, it may overrepresent how many passing images you have, so if you see a number next to complete renal, subtract this from your number of scans.
