The Adult Congenital Heart Disease Fellowship at IU School of Medicine offers an ACGME-accredited, two-year fellowship in adult congenital heart disease (ACHD). Our ACHD fellowship is a collaboration between the Division of Cardiovascular Medicine and Pediatric Cardiology, Riley Hospital for Children at the IU School of Medicine. By utilizing and integrating both programs we can provide exceptional and importantly patient centered ACHD care. IU Health is the only ACHD center in the state of Indiana. Therefore, we receive referrals statewide and from surrounding regions (IL, OH, KY) providing substantial learning opportunities in both the inpatient and outpatient clinical settings. Our program provides ACHD fellows with not only advanced training in the field of ACHD but also exposure to cardio-obstetrics, preventive cardiology, advanced imaging (cardiac MR/cardiac CT), advanced heart failure/pulmonary hypertension, electrophysiology, and diagnostic and interventional catheterization. The goals of our ACHD fellowship are to train ACHD fellows that understand the management of multisystem disease in the ACHD patient, the need for ongoing collaboration between pediatric and adult providers, the social determinants of health unique to ACHD patients, promote social integration of people with CHD, and provide high-quality care that is cost-effective across the lifespan of the ACHD patient.
