

#### The general public:

· Anyone age 18-64 without high risk conditions.

#### Highest-risk health care workers and individuals:

- · People who have direct contact with COVID-19 patients for 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period.
- · Long-term care facility staff and residents.


#### 1B

#### Moderate-risk health care workers and responders:

- · Health care workers with less direct contact with COVID-19 patients.
- · Workers in home health/hospice and dental settings.
- · EMS, firefighters, police, correctional workers, dispatchers, funeral services, other first responders, and COVID-19 response personnel.

#### Higher-risk individuals and essential workers:

- · People age 65 or older.
- · People of any age with obesity. diabetes, chronic lung disease, significant heart disease, chronic kidney disease, cancer, or are immunocompromised.
- · People who interact directly with the public at work, such as grocery store workers and school staff.
- · People who work in high density settings like farms and meat-packing plants.
- · Workers serving people that live in high-density settings.
- · Other health care workers not covered in Phase 1.
- · Adults who received a placebo during a COVID-19 vaccine clinical trial.














































## COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution

- These categories could change based on ACIP recommendations or based on safety data for new populations that may allow them to be added to phases.
- Phase 1a: Anyone with prolonged contact with potential COVID-19 patients.
  - HCW includes providers, nurses, ancillary services, EVS, FNS, etc.
  - Not limited to in-patient and should include urgent care ambulatory, ED, etc.
  - CDPHE has long-term pharmacy agreements with Walgreens and CVS. They will be responsible for on-site vaccination of SNFs and LTCFs. Logistics of how this is going to happen will be forthcoming to CDPHE soon.
- Phase 1B: Individuals with less direct care of COVID-19 than Phase 1a.
  - Hospital staff working in-patient non-COVID-19 units or out-patient settings.
  - EMS, correctional workers, fire, funeral services, dispatchers, etc. including those doing COVID-19 testing.
- Phase 2: Age >65 years, Essential workers (teachers, grocery stores, etc.) or work or serve in high density settings (e.g. meat packing plants), or under conditions that put individuals at higher risk for exposure



## UCHealth COVID-19 Vaccine Process

- Phases of distribution will follow CDPHE guidelines
- •Individuals in each phase will receive message in My Health Connection (MHC) to schedule their first and second vaccine clinic dates
  - All staff, providers, contractors and residents that work at UCHealth will be included
- Information regarding location of the vaccine administration site along with information regarding potential side effects will be sent via MHC portal after scheduling the appointment
- Designated vaccine administration sites will be set up on specific dates to accommodate as many people as feasible based on the vaccine supply received

- Smartphone-based tool that uses text messaging and web surveys to provide personalized health check-ins after you receive a COVID-19 vaccination.
- Through v-safe, you can quickly tell CDC if you have any side effects after getting the COVID-19 vaccine.
- Depending on your answers, someone from CDC may call to check on you and get more information.
- And **v-safe** will remind you to get your second COVID-19 vaccine dose if you need one.

## **State Vaccine Supplies and Needs**

- Based on Population Colorado will receive
   1.69% of the available national supply
- The initial shipments will all be Pfizer vaccine
- For the first shipment the state will receive 46,800 doses between December 11<sup>th</sup> and 14th
- There are 331,500 people in the initial priority group of Health Care Personnel and residents and staff of Long-Term Care Facilities

## **Denver Health Vaccination Plans**

Vaccine prioritization will follow Federal/State guidance.

- Initial delivery expect latter part of December
- ~2000 doses of vaccine expected next week
- Pfizer vaccine expected first, followed by Moderna
- Vaccination will NOT be required


