- Minimally invasive approach to IPH
- Stereotactic biopsy
- Ultrasound in neurosurgery

Care beyond surgery



- Physical Medicine/Rehabilitation timing and strategies in ICU/HDU
 - Speech therapy
 - Respiratory therapy





Nursing parallel lectures with bedside teaching.

Topics included: Management of TBI/cerebral edema/increased intracranial pressure, post-op care, seizures, recognizing DI, SIADH, and AI, neurological exam, pressure ulcers

Building a Sustainable Future in Neurosurgical Care

- Knowledge exchange
 - Weekly zoom lectures with MOI critical care team including quarterly rehab/respiratory/speech focused presentation
 - Monthly journal club with MOI Neurosurgery and residents
 - Bimonthly zoom lectures with Mbarara Neurosurgery and nursing team
- Improved patient outcomes
 - Decreased mortality
 - Improved infection rates
- Continuing collaboration between CU and MOI and Mbarara
 - Opportunities for research, training, and patient care improvement
