

## Requesting student research assistants

### MPH students (practicum/capstone projects)

1. Key contact(s) for the project (i.e., the individual(s) who will be responsible for mentoring the student) and background on the organization
2. Purpose and description of the project (including start date)
3. Overarching question/sub-questions the project will answer
4. Skills students should already possess to contribute effectively to the project
5. Skills students are likely to develop through their participation in the project

### Medical students

Option 1: The first platform is a database of **new projects** that we expect students will use to search for research and scholarly projects in which they can get involved. Provide the following:

1. Name of PI/Mentor
2. Email of PI/Mentor
3. PI/Mentor department and division
4. Project Title
5. Brief description of the project
6. Steps needed to complete (Ex: protocol development, work on IRB/IACUC, data collection, data Analysis, drafting the paper, paper revision, etc.)
7. Length of project: short-term (urgent) or long-term (longitudinal)

Option 2: The second platform provides a site to post a **project that has already been prepared and submitted in poster form, but perhaps has lost momentum and hasn't made it to the manuscript phase**. Again, these are posters where there is room for a medical student to assist you and contribute to the overall work. You can upload the poster itself to the main Teams site, which is divided by specialty; or you can put the poster in the "Files" section.
