- 6. Compliance with the ACGME duty hour requirements. Call is optional and will be at the discretion of the chief resident.

#### **Rotation Schedule**

University of Colorado - 2 weeks Children's Hospital of Colorado, Denver Health, **OR** Veteran's Administration - 2 weeks

Please contact the Chief Resident of your assigned service to determine what cases and clinics are scheduled. You will be assigned a faculty mentor at each of the two sites during your rotation. Try to spend at least 50% of your time with these faculty members, so they can get to know you, and you can have continuity of experience. Since we often have several medical students rotating at the same time, please adhere to your assigned weekly schedule to minimize overlap and optimize your experience.

#### **Instructions for Oral Presentation**

Time: 10 minutes - please strictly adhere to this time limit

Format: PowerPoint

Topic: You are free to present on the topic of your choice. Most students choose an interesting patient case they saw while on rotation and then briefly review the literature available about the diagnosis. You are welcome to seek input from residents or faculty prior to your presentation to make sure you are on the right track.

Date: You will be given a specific date for your presentation at the beginning of your rotation. This will usually be the last Thursday you are with us, during resident conference.
