Tenwek Hospital Details

- Built in 1959
- Provides primary care to 400,000, referral center
- 308 beds, 6 ORs, 7 bed ICU, NICU
- 11,000 inpatients, 5000 surgeries, 1700 endoscopies annually







Tenwek Hospital Details

- Lab, blood bank, 2 XR machines, 2 US; no CT/MRI, no path
 - 12 CTs in Kenya vs. 6000 in US
- Training: surgery residency (COSECSA), general medical internship, nursing school, chaplaincy school
- "Mission" of hospital







Tenwek Experience

- Joined Kenyan surgery residents
- Chief resident role/call
- Clinic 2X/wk
- OR
 - 50 cases in 4 weeks
- Education
 - Participated/Led teaching conferences, established TPN protocol



- Trauma
 - "Golden Hour" is transport
 - Volume increased w/ paved road in region
 - 5X increased volume in past 30yrs in Kenya
 - Assaults over disputes regarding land, cows, women
 - Patients kept hostage until bill paid





- CA
 - Esophageal SCC endemic in Western Kenya
 - Most common malignancy at Tenwek (35%), 11% in patients < 30y/o vs. 1% in other endemic areas of world (N Iran, Kazakhstan, S Africa, N China)
 - 90% present inoperable, no local XRT/chemo available, offered palliative stents (\$13 charge without sedation, \$26 with)

- O CA
 - Esophageal SCC continued
 - Recent publication on 1000 selfexpanding metal stents in 9yrs without fluoroscopy: Improved dysphagia scores, 3% perforation rate, median survival 250d for those with f/u
 - Case control studies: not HPV-, ETOH-related; hot tea, polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons, familial linkage, viral discovery projects ongoing
 - Other CA: gastric, breast, hepatocellular

Panel: Indications and contraindications for SEMS placement at Tenwek Hospital

Indications for SEMS as opposed to surgical resection

- · Distant metastases
- · Tracheo-oesophageal fistula
- Phrenic or recurrent laryngeal nerve palsy

Relative indications for SEMS as opposed to surgical resection

- Age > 80 years
- Extreme cachexia or malnutrition
- · Poor exercise tolerance
- Marked medical comorbidities
- HIV positivity

Absolute contraindications for SEMS


Tumour involving the upper oesophageal sphincter

Relative contraindications for SEMS

Extensive tumour involvement of the gastric cardia.




- - Typhoid fever
 - TB
 - PUD
- Bowel obstructions
 - Volvulus
 - Hernias



- Pediatric Surgery
 - Congenital anomalies
 - Pediatric tumors
- Endocrine
 - Goiters
- Amputations
 - Mostly infectious, not ischemic etiology
 - Profound implications
