INNOVATION

• First GIM M&M was a huge success:

- 100% of survey participants found the information useful
- 83% rated the M&M excellent and 17% rated it good
- Implemented process to review deaths and ICU admissions for Lowry and Anschutz patients
- Initiated work to get a post mortem note to the PCP for deaths occurring in outside facilities

PRIMARY CARE

• Integration with Mental Health

- Extended psychiatry relationship to DIMG
- Launched Mental Health Care Coordinator pilot at Anschutz
- Access to mental health specialists in every clinic
- Leveraged e-consults to collaborate with psychiatry on 48 cases in final quarter

• Aligned GIM clinics

- Strengthened connections between Anschutz, Lowry, DIMG, WISH, and Patient Coordinated Services

- Palliative Care Clinic, Neuro-Palliative Care Clinic, and inpatient consult service

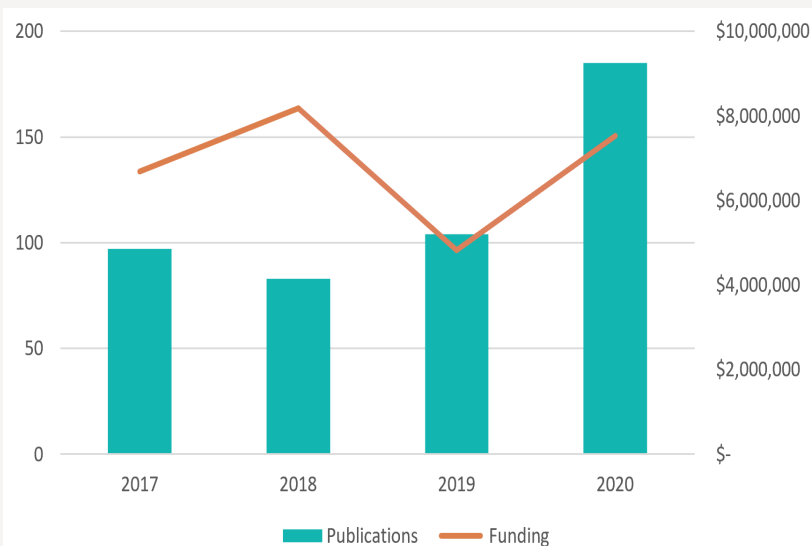

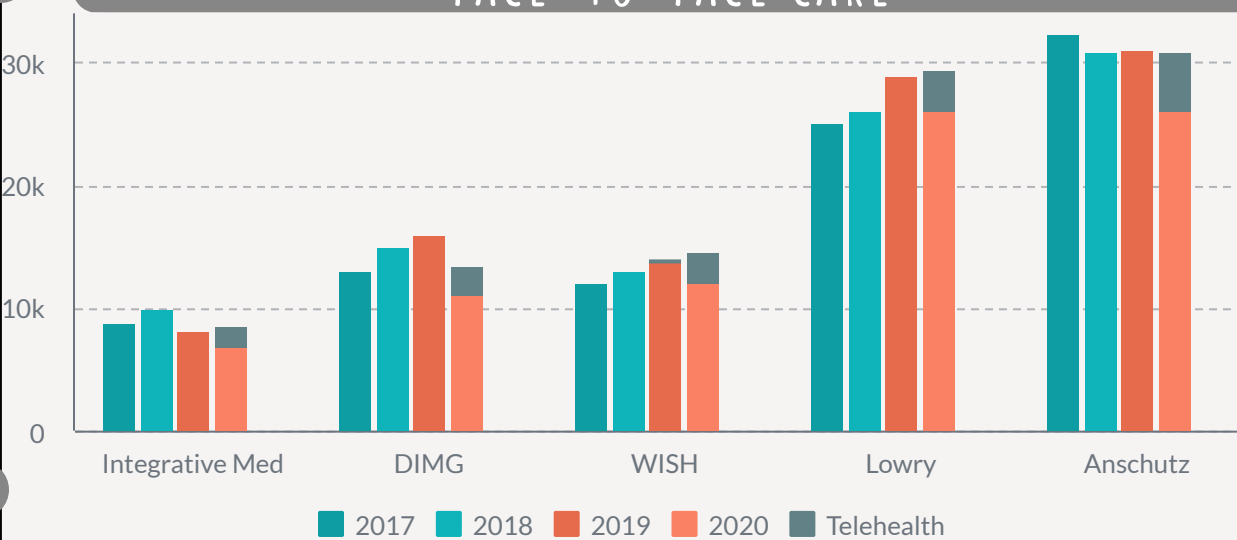

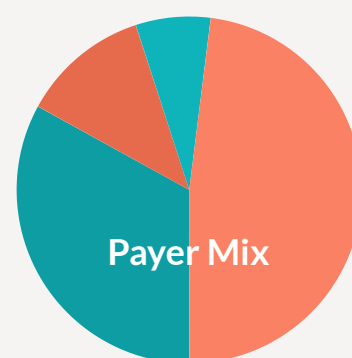
