Steven C. Johnson, MD 2025 Lifetime Achievement Award University of Colorado Hospital

Steven Johnson, MD, to Receive Lifetime Achievement Award from UCHealth

Steven Johnson will be honored with the prestigious Lifetime Achievement Award from the University of Colorado Hospital on February 6. This esteemed recognition celebrates Steve's dedication and decades of service as a physician. Steve has been a pivotal figure in infectious diseases, particularly in HIV treatment in Colorado. He is a Professor of Medicine and is the Director of the University of Colorado HIV/AIDS Clinical Program, as well as the Medical Director of the Colorado AIDS Education and Training Center. For nearly 25 years, he provided specialized HIV care across Colorado, ensuring access to communities on the Western Slope. Beyond his work with HIV, Steve played a crucial role in shaping national COVID-19 treatment guidelines as a member of the NIH COVID-19 Treatment Guidelines Panel.

The UCHealth Lifetime Achievement Award is a significant honor, recognizing Steve's profound impact on public health and his remarkable achievements. This award is a well-deserved testament to his contributions to the field of medicine. Congratulations, Steve!



Tim Gill Honored with Presidential Medal of Freedom

Tim Gill was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom by President Biden for his advocacy for LGBTQ rights and HIV awareness on January 4, 2025. A Colorado native, entrepreneur, and activist for positive social change, Tim Gill is one of the nation's leading funders to secure full equality for LGBTQ people. The Gill Foundation has invested more than \$442 million in programs and nonprofit organizations since it's founding.

At CU and in our division, Tim Gill was a recipient of the University of Colorado Distinguished Service award in 1996. Gill endowed the Tim Gill Professorship in Infectious Diseases in 1998. The Professorship was established to support HIV research at the University of Colorado and to promote HIV education at the University and within the Colorado Community. Each year, a Tim Gill Distinguished Lecturer is selected based on expertise in HIV research and care, for their skill in teaching, and for their humanism that informs and enhances their communities and the world. Our division is proud to be supported by Tim Gill and joins in celebration of this honor.

Researchers across Colorado, led by **Josh Barocas**, **MD**, and resident Matthew Westfall, MD, of the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus, combined multiple data sources for youth aged 14 to 17 in the city of Denver to estimate the total number of youth experiencing homelessness, accounting for those not reached by services. This estimation found the prevalence of youth homelessness to be significantly greater than previously estimated.
