### Vital Sign Assessment and Interpretation

<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Recall vital sign parameters, including normal and abnormal results</li> <li>2. Demonstrate competency in performance of vital sign assessment with a patient</li> <li>3. Recognize the importance of vital sign monitoring during a patient encounter</li> </ol>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Students and CI will select one or more appropriate patient to assess vital signs with.</li> <li>2. Students will select appropriately sized blood pressure cuff for patient</li> <li>3. Students will complete BP, HR, RR and O2 saturation assessment with patient(s). CI will provide feedback on technique and any necessary modifications.</li> <li>4. CI and students will discuss results and identify any abnormal values.
