








Scientists and physicians from the Crnic Institute at the University of Colorado, Children's Hospital Colorado, and Children's Hospital Los Angeles have teamed up to investigate potential treatments for Down Syndrome Regression Disorder (DSRD).



WHY PARTICIPATE?

• Examine the safety and effectiveness of different potential treatments for DSRD.

WHO CAN PARTICIPATE?

- People with Down syndrome between 8-30 years old who have symptoms or diagnosis of DSRD.*
- Participants must be accompanied by a study partner and agree to a randomized treatment assignment.
- *Additional participation criteria apply.

WHAT IS INVOLVED?

- Attend 8 study visits over 12 weeks in Denver, CO, or Los Angeles, CA.
- Follow one of three randomized treatment plans: lorazepam, IVIG or tofacitinib.
- Additional testing and monitoring.
