Purpose/Background of the Training

A Brighter Future: Navigating the World of Disability and Employment was funded by the Colorado Developmental Disabilities Council.

The purpose of this training is to provide a statewide training curriculum to educate youth with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their parents and/or guardians about Employment First, about the possibilities, processes, potential services, systems navigation, and strategies for securing work.





What was our Process?

- Determined 6 topics that promote employment conversations in transition.
- Formed a curriculum development team that included key input from a paid Youth Lead and Family Member Lead as well as subject matter experts in each topic area.
- Engaged in listening sessions with Youth and Families for discover what was important to them in each topic area.
- Developed a two-track training, one track for Youth and one track for Families/Caregivers.
- Included an activity for each topic area for users to apply information learned.
- Offer the training on demand for new and past user access

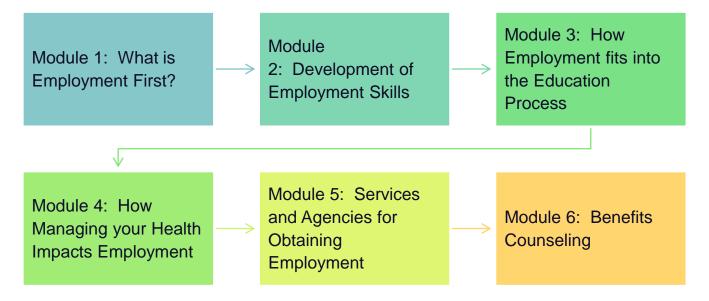

Six Important Topics for Youth Transitioning to Adulthood





Module 1: What is Employment First?

- Philosophy- what does Employment First mean?
 - Why is it important for youth? Why does it matter to me?
 - How should this impact my decision making or how I advocate for services?
 - Types of employment (competitive integrated employment, supported employment, customized employment, selfemployment)
- The Importance of High Expectations for Employment
 - Early conversations that employment is possible
- Developing a Vision for Life After High School
 - Person-Centered Planning



What is Employment First?

- A belief & <u>value</u> that all individuals regardless of level of disability are capable of full inclusion and working in Competitive Integrated Employment (CIE).
- It is the *first and preferred outcome*, regardless of level of disability in businesses found in the community, with regular compensation, equal advancement and equal interaction with non-disabled co-workers.
- It is critical to *create expectations* that all people can work if they want!
- Systems Change & <u>Culture Shift</u> to alleviate fears associated with working and educating employers on how to support a more diverse workforce!

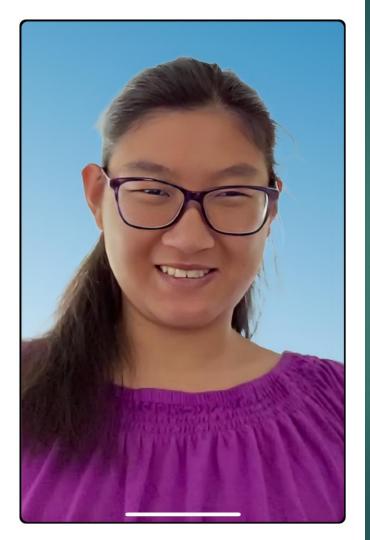

The Importance of High Expectations





- The belief and value that **everyone has the right to work** regardless of level or significance of disability.
- Expectations can be set by anyone including family, friends, teachers, and service providers; and their expectations can **positively or negatively** influence a person's vision for themselves.



Have you ever experienced a situation where someone said something about you, and it has stuck with you forever?



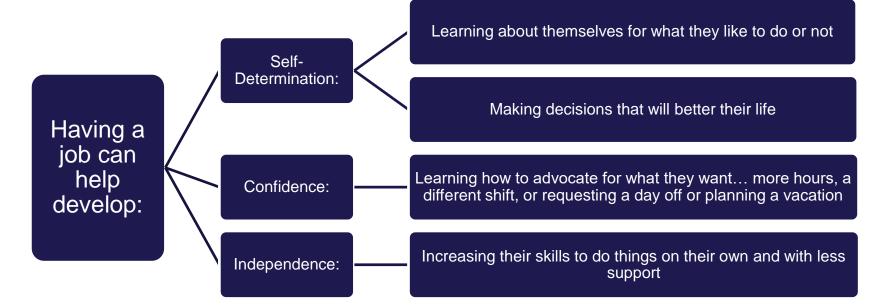
High Expectations

With supports in place, we can promote High Expectations that include:

- Participating in household chores and responsibilities
- Contributing to team projects that include taking specific roles and leadership opportunities
- Becoming a volunteer
- Sharing often about employment dreams and interests
- Encouraging early employment experiences such as job shadowing, informational interviews, internships, etc.
