For over forty years, hundreds of kids with bleeding disorders and many of their siblings have attended Mile High Summer Camp. This opportunity allowed children who have rare bleeding disorders to connect, have fun, learn, and grow with others who experience similar circumstances. It was a hard choice in the past two years to shift camp to mostly virtual events, but NHF Colorado and the HTC are very excited to share that Mile High Summer Camp will be an in-person event in 2022!

This decision came after careful review of data and guidance from the CDC and other sources, as well as evaluating the current local restrictions and levels of COVID spread. At the moment, plans are in place to move forward with an in-person camp with a few adjustments and some health requirements.

To keep everyone as safe as we can, camp this year will have capacity restrictions, giving priority to participants diagnosed with a bleeding disorder. As the capacity allows, siblings could be admitted to camp as well.

The teen leadership weekend will be on **July** 15-17, 2022 for teens ages 15-17 only. Teen campers will not be attending at the Rocky Mountain Village location. Campers must be 15 on the first day of camp, and campers turning 18 during camp will not be permitted

to attend. The teen weekend will be managed by Breckenridge Outdoor Education Center (BOEC) and COVID-19 vaccination is required.

The main Mile High Summer camp will be on **July 17-21, 2022** and will be limited to campers ages 7-14 years old. Campers must be at least age 7 by the first day of camp. This will be held at Easterseals Rocky Mountain Village and COVID-19 vaccination is also required to attend.

Our HTC staff will be attending, supporting, and teaching at both camps and are looking forward to seeing many of our patients enjoy this incredible opportunity. Cost of camp is provided by NHF Colorado and supported by the HTC. Campers are asked to pay a \$25 non-refundable registration fee.

Registration is open and the deadline is **June 13**, **2022**. There are limitations on space, so sign up ASAP! Please review the registration checklist for details of all requirements before signing up, as you will need to upload multiple documents. There are no exceptions to the vaccination requirements for 2022 camp. For questions about camp, check out the NHF Colorado camp page or contact Hanna Beary at hbeary@hemophilia.org.

GENETIC COUNSELING: AN INCREDIBLE RESOURCE



How do your genetics impact your family tree? Our genetic counselor can help!

Bleeding disorders such as hemophilia, von Willebrand disease, as well as other blood disorders can often be the result of a genetic condition.

Have you ever wondered:

- Is my blood disorder hereditary?
- How do I talk to my family about my condition?
- Should my family members be tested for my disorder?
- Will my kids be affected?
- How can genetic testing be useful?
- Are there resources

available to families with my genetic condition?

These are just a few questions people with inherited bleeding disorders may ask. Our HTC provides genetic counseling as a part of our comprehensive care. Whether you are an established patient or new to our HTC, our genetic counseling team would like to meet with you for a virtual appointment as a part of your care.

Genetic counseling sessions are currently offered *only via telehealth* and last about 45-60 minutes. This gives you an opportunity to chat with your genetic counselor in the comfort of your own home or a private space.

During each session your genetic counselor will review your personal history, family history, and genetic details of your condition. Genetic counseling sessions are offered at no cost to you! These consultations are included as a part of your care at the HTC. Your genetic counselor will explain any costs that could arise from various tests that may be available to you.

You can reach out to your genetic counselor as frequently as you need, though most often we'd like to meet with you when you join our HTC, and every few years to check-in.

This is an easy way for you to learn more about how genetics can impact you and your family as well as find resources to help.

There are three ways for you get started with genetic counseling at the HTC:

- 1. Stop by the front desk when you are in the office to schedule an appointment.
- 2. Call to schedule an appointment at 303-724-0724.
- 3. If you are in our clinic for a yearly visit, you should receive a MyChart invite for genetic counseling after your visit. Just respond to schedule your appointment!

desk, and our staff will be sending out letters to those who live in these locations as we approach each date. Some of these clinics we are not yet scheduling.


