October is American Pharmacists Month! We celebrate the specialized 340B Pharmacy at our HTC this month for all of their hard work throughout the year to provide medications and support to our patients.

Our HTC Pharmacy is one of only a few specialty pharmacies that is dually accredited with both the Utilization Review Accreditation Commission (URAC) and the Accreditation Commission for Health Care (ACHC). This means that our pharmacy has done detailed work to make sure that we meet all the requirements and standards set by both organizations. They are each non

-profit organizations that hold pharmacies accountable to the highest standards and verify that our pharmacy provides the excellence in care our patients need and deserve.

We are also a 340B Pharmacy, which means that we are designated by the federal government to operate as a non-profit organization and purchase bleeding disorder medication at a discount. This comes with the stipulation that the profits our pharmacy generates are invested directly into the HTC to lower the cost of care for patients.

Our pharmacy team works with patients and providers in our clinic to make sure each patient is receiving the most appropriate treatment. Pharmacists are there to help with support for patients, answering questions, explaining how medications are administered, and how to properly use and store them. Each year our pharmacy team surveys patients who receive medication from us on our performance, and responses remain overwhelmingly positive. We continue to strive to find ways to make things easier for patients. This year we added a new way to pay pharmacy bills online! Our pharmacy team is led by our Pharmacy Manager, Desi Hill, and includes Senior Clinical Pharmacist Bruce Young and Pharmacists Aaron Barcelo and Suzanne Kasim. We have two Pharmacy Technicians, Talia Garramone and Derrick Keesling, who assist pharmacists with orders and prepare the packages we send out. Trish Tucker is our Pharmacy Assistant, and Candice Murchison is our Pharmacy Revenue Cycle Specialist. We also have the help of Lillian Afrifa as an intern in our pharmacy.

Our team works closely together and enjoy spending time outside of work connecting. ### **CHANGE COMES FOR PEDIATRIC STROKE PROGRAM**

For the past 18 years, our HTC hosted a Pediatric Stroke program in support of children who experienced a stroke as well as those with unique pediatric neurological conditions related to stroke. We also hosted a pediatric stroke parent support group to provide education and a way to connect with others in similar circumstances.

We developed this program in conjunction with Children's Hospital Colorado (CHCO) and we shared some resources, doctors, nurses, other support staff and our experience as we helped children and their families facing the consequences of a stroke. Often these strokes were caused by clotting disorders and it made sense to be connected to our center which handles thrombosis issues. In the past several years, it became apparent that some of the resources that our patients needed may be better shifted to be under the Children's Hospital Colorado umbrella.

Last month, we transferred this program to the care of Children's Hospital Colorado, and we are confident in their efforts to make a difference in the lives of children who experience stroke. The reasons for children experiencing a stroke are

grateful to have been able to provide care and support for both patients and families.

Our clinic will continue to treat and care for pediatric patients experiencing cerebral venous sinus thrombosis (CVST), which is a rare blood clot condition that can lead to stroke.
